### **Course Introduction / Course Outline**

Investment and Finance 12 will give students the opportunity to become financially literate citizens who will learn to understand and deal with money as a life skill. Students will learn to set financial goals, to become familiar with the changing Canadian banking system, to understand how to make wise decisions when investing, and to know that they can influence their own financial future. Students will accomplish the above understanding through independent research, team projects and technology presentations. Students will be able to comprehend a very broad range of investment options, which are available in the marketplace. They will be able to apply their knowledge in order to make financial decisions; thereby, developing and applying lifetime financial skills.

Unit 2: Financial Markets (20%)

Unit 3: Budgeting and Credit (15%)

Final Assessment (20%)

When determining a student's final grade:

- ✓ No single assessment tool (i.e. presentations, labs, demonstrations, portfolios, debates, written tests/quizzes) will account for more than half of the value of each Gradebook category
- ✓ Learning trends over time will be considered, more recent student work and the teacher's professional judgment
- ✓ Students will participate in a final cumulative assessment opportunity that allows them to demonstrate an appropriate range of the learning outcomes and process skills involved in the course

#### **Assessment Practices**

Formatively - How someone IS learning material throughout a course; this looks like a Checkmark 
✓ on PowerSchool (recorded as a zero if not completed)

**Summatively** - How someone HAS learned material throughout a course; this looks like a numerical mark on PowerSchool (recorded as a zero if not completed)

To include...

- ✓ Assessment for Learning/Formative Assessment... the ongoing process of gathering and interpreting evidence about student learning for the purpose of determining where students are in their learning, where they need to go, and how best to get there; instructional strategy that takes place while the student is still learning and served to promote learning
- ✓ Assessment of Learning/Summative Assessment... process of analyzing, reflecting upon, and summarizing assessment information and making a judgment and/or decision based upon the information gathered.
- ✓ List of Assessment Types... eg. observations, conversations, products
- ✓ List of Assessment Tools... include, but are not limited to work samples, presentations, tests/quizzes, debates, projects, checklists, portfolios, experiments, demonstrations, anecdotal notes, graphic/visual representations, models, oral and/or written reports, journals, logs, performances
